

## **Engaging Police and Fire Departments for Support**

### **1. During the Launch:**

- **Invite Them to Participate:**  
Reach out to your local police or fire department and ask them to join the first ride. Their presence makes a big statement about community safety and collaboration.
- **Collaborate on Safety Workshops:**  
Organize pre-launch safety sessions where police or firefighters can teach kids and parents and caregivers about bike safety, road rules, and emergency tips.
- **Plan an Escort for Launch Day:**  
Request a police or fire escort for the initial ride to ensure visibility and to help with traffic management, particularly on busier roads.

### **2. Ongoing Engagement During the School Year:**

- **Periodic Participation:**  
Encourage police officers or firefighters to join rides throughout the year, especially on high-traffic days or during special events. Their presence builds trust and reinforces safety.
- **Offer Recognition Events:**  
Collaborate with your local departments to host milestone events or celebrations for the kids. It's a great way to acknowledge participants and strengthen partnership.
- **Provide Safety Tips:**  
Ask police and fire officials to share seasonal safety advice, such as tips for biking in different weather conditions or navigating roads as daylight changes.

### **3. Enhancing Road Safety on Busier Routes:**

- **Request Traffic Escorts:**  
For routes with high traffic or challenging intersections, ask for periodic police or fire escorts. Their vehicles or bikes with flashing lights increase visibility and encourage driver caution.
- **Work Together on Route Planning:**  
Consult with local departments to identify safer routes or intersections and explore the possibility of adding crossing guards or temporary signage for peak biking times.

- **Promote the Collaboration:** Highlight their involvement through school newsletters, social media, and community events to build awareness and appreciation.
